Speakers Panel:

Juan Tubert-Oklander, MD, PhD is a psychoanalyst, group analyst, and marriage and family psychotherapist, who was born, studied medicine, and trained as a group therapist in Buenos Aires, Argentina. He lives and works in private practice in Mexico City since 1976, where he trained in adult and child psychoanalysis, being now a Mexican citizen. Author of numerous papers and book chapters, published in Spanish, English, Italian, French, Portuguese, Czech, and Hebrew. Co-author, with Reyna Hernández-Tubert, of *Operative Groups: The Latin-American Approach to Group Analysis* (Jessica Kingsley, 2004) and author of *Theory of Psychoanalytical Practice: A Relational Process Approach* (IPA/Karnac, 2013) and *The One and the Many: Relational Psychoanalysis and Group Analysis* (London: Karnac, 2014), as well as several books in Spanish. Full Member of the Argentine Psychoanalytic Association and the International Psychoanalytical Association, Honorary Member of the Group-Analytic Society International, Founding Member of the International Field Theory Association, and Member of the International Association of Relational Psychoanalysis and Psychotherapy. Professor in the Master's Degree Course of Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy at the Marista University of Mérida.

Earl Hopper, Ph.D. is a psychoanalyst, group analyst and organisational consultant in private practice in London. He is a Fellow of the British Psychoanalytical Society, an Honorary Member of the Institute of Group Analysis (UK), an Honorary Member of the Group Analytic Society International, and a Distinguished Fellow of the American Group Psychotherapy Association. Formerly a lecturer in Sociology at the London School of Economics, Cambridge University and the University of Leicester, he is an Honorary Tutor at The Tavistock and Portman NHS Trust and a member of the Faculty of the Post-Doctoral Program at Adelphi University, New York. His special interests include the study of social issues and of personal and social trauma. The author of many books and articles in sociology, psychoanalysis and group analysis, Dr Hopper is the Editor of the *New International Library of Group Analysis* (NILGA).

Dr Regine Scholz is a licensed psychotherapist and group analyst working in private practice, specialising in trauma treatment. From 2010-2017 she was a member of the Management Committee of the Group Analytic Society International, responsible for organising the summer schools. Originally trained in Munster, she is a training analyst of the German Society for Group Analysis and Group Psychotherapy (D3G), an organization of which she is a founding member and where nowadays she is the speaker for the special interest group Group Analysis in Education, Culture and Society. She is the former editor of *Arbeitshefte Gruppenanalyse* and recently became a member of the Editorial Committee of Group Analysis. Her own publications mainly concern the psychic impact of culture and collective trauma. Additionally, she is fellow of the International Dialogue Initiative (IDI), an organization dedicated to psycho-political dialogue founded by Vamik Volkan.

Marina Mojović, MD, MSc. is a psychiatrist, individual psychoanalytic psychotherapist, group analyst and organizational consultant in private practice. She is a training group analyst, supervisor and member of training committee in the Group Analytic Society-Belgrade, founder of its Psycho-Social Section and Training, and co-founder of Section for Large and Median Groups; she is also a member of the Group Analytic Society International, International Association for Group Psychotherapy and Group Processes, European Group-Analytic Training Institutes Network, International Society for Psychoanalytic Studies of Organizations, and Organization for Promoting Understanding of Society (London). She is a founder of the Serbian Reflective-Citizens Program and Social-Dreaming Training. Special interests: social unconscious, social trauma, large groups, author of the concepts "*social-psychic-retreats*" and "*conception trauma*".
